

How to book onto a course

Register with scheme

Before starting your journey to becoming a Cave and/or Mine Leader you must first register with the LCMLA scheme. There is a one-off fee to register for the award scheme.

Register for a course

Candidates may register directly with a Trainer/Assessor or, if a Trainer/Assessors course is advertised may register directly through the award schemes Candidate Management System (CMS).

Please read the course details before registering (booking) onto a course, making sure any pre-requisites are met.

If registering directly with a Trainer/Assessor, you will need to provide the Trainer/Assessor the following details in the same format you've entered them into the CMS:

- First Name
- Last Name
- Membership Number (note this starts with ME)
- Date of Birth

If registering via the CMS candidates need to find a course

- Find a course
 - Click on Events & Courses
 - Select your course type & region
 - Once you've found a course click on "Add to cart" (note if you do not meet the pre-requisites for this course this button may not be visible)
 - Follow the payment method, even though the payment will be zero, and complete the order

Once registered for a course your course provider will be in touch with joining instructions and invoicing details. Please be aware that your place on a course may only be guaranteed once your course provider has confirmed this with you (normally reliant on payment for your course being received)

Cave & Mine Leader Group Day Assessment

A one-day practical group management assessment in a venue that is one at the upper level of difficulty of the sites on the candidates submitted list and agreed with the Trainer/Assessor.

Pre-requisites

Have completed the Cave and Mine Core Skills Assessment. Candidates would be expected to satisfy a Trainer/Assessor that they have sufficient personal logged experience within the Caves/Mines they wish to be included on their Qualifications site list.

Must be completed within 1 year of the core skills assessment.

Course Overview

A ratio of 1 Trainer/Assessor to 1 candidate only for this module.

The Trainer/Assessor can be the same as the person that did your cave and mine leader training but not the core skills assessment.

The first part of the assessment is theoretical and is normally based upon a written response to a question paper based on the content of the assessment. The paper is completed in the candidate's own time and is unsupervised. If desired, a candidate may opt to cover this work orally, though this will increase the duration of the assessment.

The second part of the assessment is a practical assessment at an appropriate location underground. The candidate will also provide their own group (a minimum of 5), group equipment and optional assistant leader. The duration of the assessment is at the discretion of the Trainer/Assessor and would normally consist of a full day.

Where a candidate is deferred they must in general return to the original Trainer/Assessor – but can opt to do a complete reassessment with any Trainer/Assessor. If a candidate 'fails' they may choose any Trainer/Assessor for reassessment. It was also agreed that safety issues which require the candidate to go underground again will be an automatic fail. Issues such as geology weakness would mean a defer and can be resolved by an interview. The Trainer/Assessor has the right to terminate the assessment if the candidate is not up to the required standard in fundamental areas of the syllabus relating to safety or conservation.

The full checklist used by Trainer/Assessors which forms the syllabus for this award is provided below. Candidates should ensure they are familiar with all aspects of the checklist prior to booking an assessment.

The award is valid for 5 years provided the candidate remains active and maintains a valid First Aid Certificate. The award must be updated before it expires by either attending an update workshop or attending a Vertical Leader training course.
